

A GUIDE TO CAMPING



WELCOME

This camping information has been set out to help maximise your comfort and enjoyment of the campsites during the Festival of Speed.

Please remember that entry to the Festival of Speed is by advance ticket only, with no ticket sales available at the entry gates during the event. Campers are welcome to join us at Goodwood from 0900hrs on Wednesday until 1200hrs noon on Monday, so you can make the most of

your stay and avoid traffic congestion. If you require more tickets ahead of the event, please call the Ticket Office on 01243 755055, or book online at goodwood.com.

ARRIVAL AND SET UP

TRAVELLING TO THE EVENT

Goodwood is situated on the South Coast in West Sussex, three miles to the north of Chichester. For more detailed directions and a map, please visit our Getting Here page.

ARRIVALS

Camping labels will be posted to your address. Please ensure you have these clearly displayed on your windscreen on approach to Goodwood and that you leave the label in the window of your vehicle for the duration of your stay on site. All members of your party must be wearing their wristband on arrival for check in. For security purposes please wear your wristband for the duration of your stay, as access to the campsites may be denied without it.

THERE ARE THREE CAMPSITES:

Campsite H – Close to the Goodwood Hotel, this campsite is available to the public. Every plot is provided with an electric hook up and pitches are pre-allocated on booking. This is where our accessible camping area is found.

Campsite E – Running adjacent to the Motor Circuit, this campsite is available to the public and RV's. There is a choice of electric or non electric pitches.

Campsite F (Family Camping) – located at the Racecourse, this campsite is exclusively for children up to 14 who are bringing their parents along. No adult entry unless you have a child with you.

FAMILY F CAMPSITE

Our bespoke family campsite, with shuttles to and from the event, offers a child-friendly setting away from the crowds, allowing families to relax and unwind.

CAMPSITE H

Plots will be pre-allocated and numbered on the ground. The campsite manager will direct you to your plot upon arrival.

CAMPSITE OFFICE AND MANAGER

Each campsite has a campsite office located at the main entrance. During the day it is manned by the campsite team and at night it is covered by campsite security.

Open from 0900 Wednesday until noon on the Monday, the campsites operate a 2200hrs curfew. If you arrive later than 2200hrs you will be parked up for the night where you will still have access to the campsite facilities, and then taken to your pitch in the morning when you are ready.

INFORMATION BOARD

An information board is located at the entrance to each campsite with helpful information to make sure your stay is an enjoyable one.

ADDITIONAL CAMPERS

Each 9 x 7m pitch is for up to four people. Any extra people in your party will need to be paid for in advance (£48 per person) by calling the Ticket Office on **01243 755055** (open between 0900hrs – 1730hrs Wednesday and 0700hrs - 1900hrs, Thursday - Sunday).

Children aged 12 and under are not charged for camping. Children on site must be accompanied by an adult. We only sell camping pitches for the Festival of Speed weekend, not on a nightly basis.

PARKING AND VEHICLES

Your vehicles must be parked within your allocated pitch. Due to recommended fire regulations cars are not permitted to be within three metres of a sleeping unit (tent/campervan/ caravan). If you are travelling in more than one car you will be asked to park additional vehicles in the public car park close to the campsite.

All vehicles must have a visible vehicle pass in the window, showing a contact number and name for Goodwood to make contact in case of an emergency. Guest vehicle passes will be available from the Campsite Office.

If a car or vehicle is parked without a visible, completed label or not within a plot, Goodwood have the right to tow that vehicle to a public car park.

We recommend that use of your vehicle is kept to an absolute minimum during your stay.

Our curfew is in place from 2200hrs to 0700hrs every day. No car movement within the campsites will be permitted in this time. Guests will be asked to park up by the office and walk back to their plots or will be escorted by security.

Anyone witnessed to be driving inappropriately in the campsites will be asked to leave the site.

WARNINGS

OVERHEAD POWER LINES

Be advised that an overhead power line dissects the camping area. Please note the following guidelines and precautions:

directly under or close to an overhead power line. Please be particularly aware when erecting TV aerials or radio masts. • Overhead power lines are often uninsulated (bare) and can

Before setting up camp, avoid pitching your tent or caravan

- carry high voltages so always hold long objects horizontally, parallel with the ground, when walking under lines.
- The lowest-voltage overhead lines can produce 10,000 times more current than is required to kill a person. It can be fatal to touch electricity wires by human touch or with an object at low voltage. Even domestic voltage (230 volts) can be lethal.
- Don't assume wires on wooden poles are telephone wires.
- Never assume electrical equipment is dead, even if wires have fallen or broken. Power can be switched back on without warning.
- Electricity can jump gaps.
- Metal and carbon-fibre tent poles, guy lines, TV aerials and almost any long object can conduct electricity.
- Rubber boots will not protect you.
- Don't light a fire / barbecue under an overhead line, as the heat could cause the wires to sag dangerously low or

- Electricity poles and pylons are usually fitted with yellow 'danger of death' notices, and lines should be too. Take note of any warning signs and stay well away from the marked area.
- If there's a line close to where you are setting up your tent, awning or caravan, keep well away. Don't assume it's a telephone wire. If you have any doubts, please contact the Campsite Manager in the Campsite Office.
- Do not fly kites in the campsites under any circumstances.

WHAT TO DO IN AN EMERGENCY

- If you come within five metres of a damaged wire, move away as quickly as you can, and warn others to stay well clear. You don't have to touch a wire that is on the ground to be injured or killed. Electrical current can travel a long way through the ground – even further if the wire falls on a fence or metallic objects.
- Always assume the lines are live, even if they're not sparking.
- If you have a mobile with you, call the emergency services.
- If you're inside a caravan (or tent or mobile home), stay inside until the emergency services arrive.
- touch a tent, awnii you suspect is touching an electricity line.
- Wires can re-energise at any time without warning.

DURING YOUR STAY

EVENT TIMES

Gates to the Festival of Speed open at 0700hrs and close at 1900hrs.

SHUTTLE SERVICE

A courtesy shuttle service of tractors and buses will run daily from bus stops located by each campsite office throughout Campsite E to the event site from 0700hrs to 1930hrs on event days.

An evening bus service will run from Thursday to Sunday between the campsite and the Goodwood Hotel where you can enjoy live entertainment and refreshments. Buses run from the hotel at 1930hrs with the last bus leaving the hotel at 2245hrs.

TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT

To avoid any conflict with the pedestrian traffic around the campsites it is strongly recommended that you avoid using your car. Please be advised that many of the roads surrounding the campsites will be closed during the live hours of the events. If you do leave your campsite please be aware that your return journey may involve congestion and/or diversions.

No car movement is allowed between 2200hrs and 0700hrs. New arrivals will be asked to park up and will be positioned on their plot in the morning. Returning guests will be asked to park up by the office and walk back to their plots or will be escorted by security.

BARBECUES

All guests are welcome to use barbecues (please refer to 'Warnings' section). Those using disposable barbecues must use bricks from the Campsite Office to allow your barbecue to be clear of the grass. Please let the coals cool prior to disposal and put all coals into the barbecue disposal bin found at the Waste Station Point, located near to each set of campsite facilities.

GOODWOOD HEALTH & WELLEBING

If you crave a bit of 'me time' during the events, you can buy a four-day weekend pass for the Goodwood Health Club, based at The Goodwood Hotel, which includes use of the pool, gym, sauna and steam room. It costs £85 and is available from the reception desk. The Spa offers a range of relaxing treatments. Please call for availability and prices on 01243 520114.

GOODWOOD BAR AND GRILL

Based at The Goodwood Hotel, our relaxed brasserie-style restaurant provides a welcome break from campsite fare. It's open for full English breakfasts in the morning (pre-booking is advised), while offering dinner and live music on the Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings.

FOOD IN CAMPSITES

There will be a food truck open from Thursday to Sunday from 0600hrs until 1100hrs and from 1700hrs to 2130hrs.

STANDPIPES

Standpipes providing fresh drinking water are provided throughout the campsites.

WASHING-UP

Washing up facilities are located adjacent to the shower and toilet blocks. Please be considerate to your fellow campers and leave the washing up facilities in a clean and tidy state when you have finished using them.

WET WASTE (CHEMICAL TOILETS)

A disposal system for chemical waste has been provided adjacent to the shower and toilet blocks. Please note that a drive-over waste disposal system for large RV's and Winnebagos is not available on our campsites.

WET WEATHER



Our campsites are located on farm land, should the site get damaged or your vehicle get stuck in the mud due to heavy rain and unpleasant weather Goodwood will supply tow support vehicles for your assistance.


ACCESSIBLE FACILITIES

All campsites are equipped with accessible toilet and shower facilities and Campsite H has a limited number of accessible camping pitches.'

Dedicated shuttles run frequently from Campsites H and E to the main Revival site and back. If you require a wheelchair accessible shuttle, please speak to a member of staff for

USEFUL INFORMATION CAMPFIRES

WHAT3WORDS:

Campfires are strictly prohibited. Please do not attempt to build a campfire as it will be extinguished and you risk being asked to leave the campsite.

FIRE POINTS

Fire points have been installed along the central avenue (see maps, opposite).

IF YOU SHOULD DISCOVER A FIRE

- Raise the alarm by winding the siren on the Fire Point.
- Call **999** if appropriate.
- Inform the Duty Campsite Manager or the Campsite Security Team.
- Assist with firefighting but do not put yourself at risk.
- Await the arrival of Goodwood personnel and the emergency services. The fire extinguishers have been installed for your own safety. Do not remove them from their location unless required for firefighting. Anyone seen letting off the extinguishers will be charged £250 for a replacement.

FIREWORKS AND CHINESE LANTERNS

The use of fireworks and Chinese lanterns on the campsites is strictly prohibited.

FIRST AID

Please be aware that a 24-hour first aid service is not available in the campsites. Anyone requiring first aid must report to the Campsite Office where the Campsite Duty Manager and Security Team have 24-hour contact with the Goodwood Control Room, who can administer first aid. In an emergency, please call 999. The South East Coast Ambulance Service and Sussex Police have been briefed on the location of the campsites.

NOISE NUISANCE

The Festival of Speed generates noise from its sporting and entertainment activities, but campers are not expected to endure noise deemed to be a nuisance between 10.30pm and 8.30am. Please be considerate to your neighbours. Persistent noise offenders will be removed from the campsites.

ORGANIC STATUS

Goodwood Estate's Home Farm has been awarded full organic status by the Soil Association and DEFRA. In order to maintain this status we wish to keep our land free from man-made chemicals such as pesticides, insecticides and bleaches that pollute the ground and ultimately end up in the food chain. Please help us by not disposing of the following matter onto the ground: chemical waste from your onboard WC (please use the chemical waste disposal system adjacent to the shower and toilet blocks), domestic cleaning substances, boiling water and cigarette and cigar butts.

Only guide dogs are permitted on site at the Festival of Speed, including all camping and car parking areas.

On arrival you will be issued with large bin liners for rubbish. At the end of your stay, please place the bin liners and any waste in the skips adjacent to the shower and toilet blocks. Please leave your pitch in the state in which you found it. Anyone choosing to ignore this condition will not be invited to camp at Goodwood in the future.

SECURITY

A dedicated 24-hour security team in attendance at Festival of Speed from 1200hrs on Wednesday until 1200hrs on Monday. The team in in place for your own comfort and support. Please grant them every respect during your stay.

Vehicles and contents are left here entirely at the owners risk

If you experience a breach in security or any act of anti-social behaviour please report it immediately to one of the security patrols or directly to the Campsite Office.
