



A GUIDE TO CAMPING AT MEMBERS' MEETING

DURING YOUR STAY

SATURDAY NIGHT FESTIVITIES

Only accessible to those with a Saturday or weekend admission ticket. A courtesy shuttle bus service will run from 8pm to 11.30pm on Saturday for campsite guests attending the festivities.

SHUTTLE SERVICE

A courtesy shuttle service of tractors and buses will run daily from the bus stop located by the campsite office from 7.30am to 10.30pm on event days.

On Saturday a courtesy shuttle bus service will run from 8pm to 11.30pm for campsite guests attending the festivities.

TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT

To avoid any conflict with the pedestrian traffic around the campsites it is strongly recommended that you avoid using your car. Please be advised that many of the roads surrounding the campsites will be closed during the live hours of the events. If you do leave your campsite please be aware that your return journey may involve congestion and/or diversions.

No car movement is allowed between 10pm and 7am. New arrivals will be asked to park up and will be positioned on their plot in the morning. Returning guests will be asked to park up by the office and walk back to their plots or escorted to their plot by security.



WELCOME

This camping information has been set out to help maximise your comfort and enjoyment of the campsites during the Members' Meeting.

Please remember that entry to the Members' Meeting is by advance ticket only, with no ticket sales available at the entry gates during the event.

Campers are welcome to join us at Goodwood from 9am on Thursday until 12 noon on Monday so you can make the most of your stay and help avoid traffic congestion.

BARBECUES

All guests are welcome to use barbecues (see Warning! – right) Those using disposable barbecues must use bricks from the Campsite Office to allow your barbecue to be clear of the grass. Please let the coals cool prior to disposal and put all coals into the barbecue disposal bin found at the Waste Station Point, located near to each set of campsite facilities.

GOODWOOD BAR AND GRILL (AT THE HOTEL)

Our relaxed brasserie-style restaurant provides a welcome break from campsite fare. It's open for full English breakfasts and 'grab & go' options in the morning, while providing live entertainment in the evening.

FARMER, BUTCHER, CHEF BAR AND RESTAURANT (AT THE HOTEL)

From 12 noon each day you can enjoy a drink in the bar. Food is served in Farmer, Butcher, Chef Restaurant, but tables must be booked in advance on 01243 775537.

A range of relaxing spa treatments are also available but these will be charged, and must be booked in advance at goodwood.com/spa.

STANDPIPES

Standpipes providing fresh drinking water are provided throughout the campsites.

FOOD IN CAMPSITES

There will be a food truck open from Thursday to Sunday from 6am until 11am and from 5pm to 9.30pm.

WASHING-UP

Washing up facilities are located adjacent to the shower and toilet blocks. Please be considerate to your fellow campers and leave the washing up facilities in a clean and tidy state when you have finished using them.

WET WASTE (CHEMICAL TOILETS)

A disposal system for chemical waste has been provided adjacent to the shower and toilet blocks. Please note that a drive-over waste disposal system for large RVs and Winnebagos is not available on our campsites.

ARRIVALS

Please ensure your completed camping labels are clearly displayed on your windscreen on approach to Goodwood and that you leave the label in the window of your vehicle for the duration of your stay on site. All members of your party must be wearing their wristband on arrival for check in. For security purposes please wear your wristband for the duration of your stay, as access to the campsites may be denied without it.

The campsites are:

Campsite E Running adjacent to the Motor Circuit, this campsite is available to the public, competitors, marshals, exhibitors, RV's and hosts our accessible camping area. There is a choice of electric or non-electric pitches.

CAMPSITE OFFICE AND MANAGER

The campsite office is located at the main entrance to the campsite. During the day it is manned by the campsite team and at night it is covered by Campsite Security.

Open from 9am Thursday until 12 noon on the Monday, the campsites operate a 10pm curfew so please make sure you arrive before 10pm. If you arrive later than 10pm you will be parked up for the night where you will still have access to the campsite facilities, and then taken to your pitch in the morning when you are ready.

Should you have any concerns, please see the Campsite Manager. Alternatively, please call the Ticket Office (open during the event between 7am and 6pm) on 01243 755055.

INFORMATION BOARD

An information board is located at the entrance to each campsite with helpful information to make sure your stay is an enjoyable one.

WET WEATHER

Not even Goodwood can predict the British weather, so please come prepared with the necessary supplies for camping and walking in wet and cold conditions. Our campsites are located on farm land, should the site get damaged or your vehicle get stuck in the mud due to heavy rain and unpleasant weather Goodwood will supply tow support vehicles for your assistance. Before arriving please ensure that you have a towing ring with you and you know where the fixing is on your vehicle.



STAYING ON YOUR PLOT

Your vehicles must be parked within your allocated pitch. Due to recommended fire regulations cars are not permitted to be within three metres of a sleeping unit (tent/campervan/caravan). If you are travelling in more than one car you will be asked to park additional vehicles in the public car park close to the campsite.

All vehicles must have a visible vehicle pass in the window, showing a contact number and name for Goodwood to make contact in case of an emergency. Guest vehicle passes will be available from the Campsite Office.

If a car or vehicle is parked without a visible, completed label or not within a plot, Goodwood have the right to tow that vehicle to a public car park.

We recommend that use of your vehicle is kept to an absolute minimum during your stay.

Our curfew is in place from 10pm to 7am every day. No car movement within the campsites will be permitted in this time. Guests will be asked to park up by the office and walk back to their plots.

Anyone witnessed to be driving inappropriately in the campsites will be asked to leave the site.

EVENT TIMES

Gates to the Members' Meeting will open at 7.30am and close at 10pm on Saturday and 7pm on Sunday.



The lowest-voltage overhead lines can produce 10,000 times more current than is required to kill a person. It can be fatal to touch electricity wires by human touch or with an object at low voltage. Even domestic voltage (230 volts) can be lethal.

Don't assume wires on wooden poles are telephone wires. Never assume electrical equipment is dead, even if wires have fallen or broken. Power can be switched back on without warning.

Electricity can jump gaps.

Metal and carbon-fibre tent poles, guy lines, TV aerials and almost any long object can conduct electricity.

Rubber boots will not protect you.

Don't light a fire/barbecue under an overhead line, as the heat could cause the wires to sag dangerously low or to break.

Electricity poles and pylons are usually fitted with yellow 'danger of death' notices, and lines should be too. Take note of any warning signs and stay well away from the marked area.

If there's a line close to where you are setting up your tent, awning or caravan, keep well away. Don't assume it's a telephone wire. If you have any doubts, please contact the Campsite Manager in the Campsite Office.

Do not fly kites in the campsites under any circumstances.

WHAT TO DO IN AN EMERGENCY

If you come within five metres of a damaged wire, move away as quickly as you can, and warn others to stay well clear. You don't have to touch a wire that is on the ground to be injured or killed. Electrical current can travel a long way through the ground – even further if the wire falls on a fence or metallic objects.

Always assume the lines are live, even if they're not sparking.

If you have a mobile with you, call the emergency services.

If you're inside a caravan (or tent or mobile home), stay inside until the emergency services arrive.

Never touch a tent, awning, frame, caravan, post or fence you suspect is touching an electricity line.

Wires can re-energise at any time without warning.

WARNING!

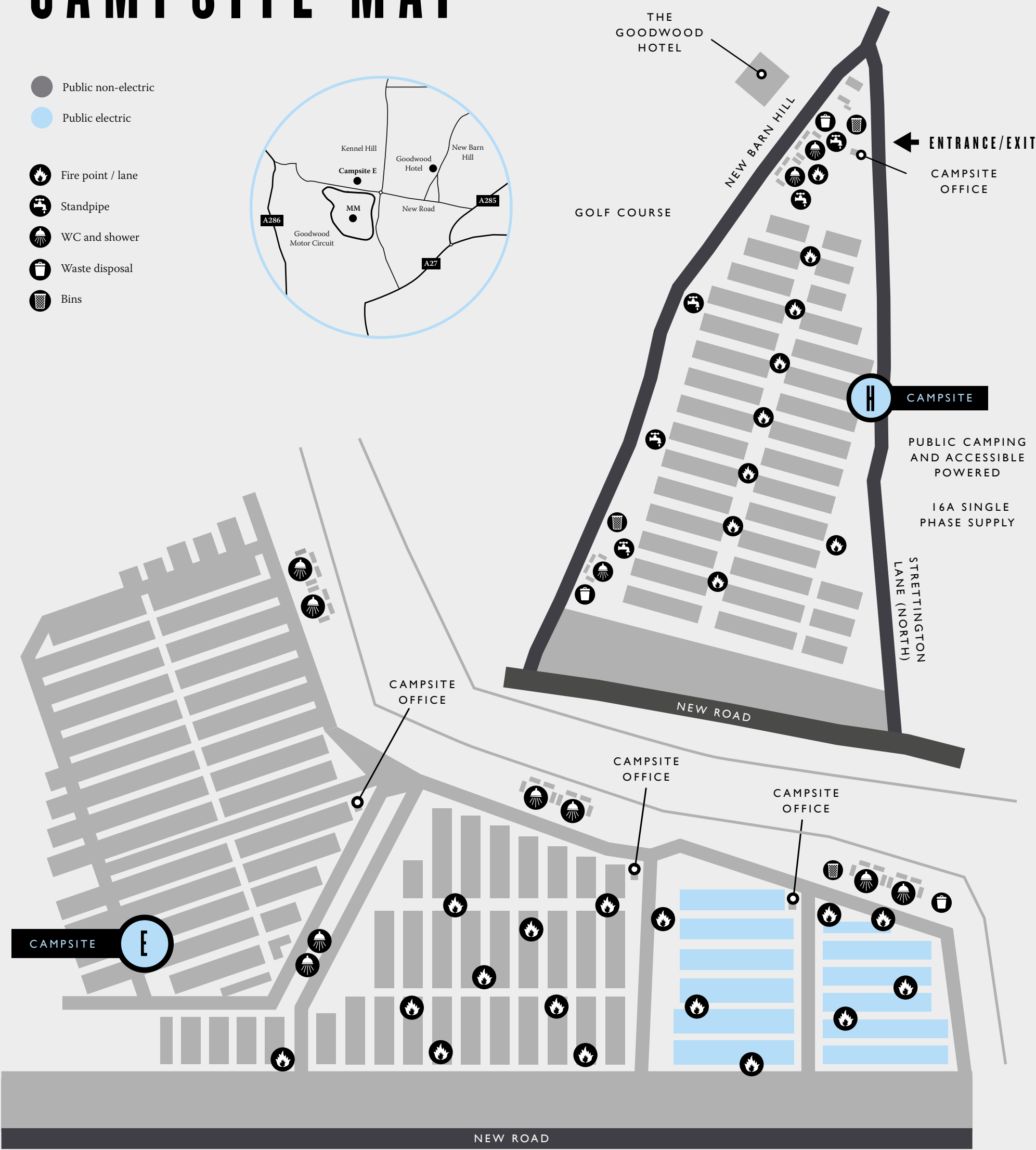
OVERHEAD POWER LINES

Be advised that an overhead power line dissects the camping area. Please note the following guidelines and precautions:

Before setting up camp, avoid pitching your tent or caravan directly under or close to an overhead power line. Be particularly aware when erecting TV aerials or radio masts.

Overhead power lines are often uninsulated (bare) and can carry high voltages so always hold long objects horizontally, parallel with the ground, when walking under lines.

SECURITY

A dedicated 24-hour security team is in attendance at the Revival from 9am on Thursday until 12 noon on Monday. The team is in place for your own comfort and support. Please grant them every respect during your stay.

DOS & DON'TS

CAMPFIRES

Campfires are strictly prohibited. Please do not attempt to build a campfire as it will be extinguished and you risk being asked to leave the campsite.

FIRE POINTS

Fire points have been installed along the central avenue (see maps, opposite).

IF YOU SHOULD DISCOVER A FIRE

Raise the alarm by winding the siren on the Fire Point.

Call 999 if appropriate.

Inform the Duty Campsite Manager or the Campsite Security Team.

Assist with firefighting but do not put yourself at risk.

Await the arrival of Goodwood personnel and the emergency services.

The fire extinguishers have been installed for your own safety. Do not remove them from their location unless required for firefighting. Anyone seen letting off the extinguishers will be charged £250 for a replacement.

FIREWORKS AND CHINESE LANTERNS

The use of fireworks or Chinese lanterns in the campsites is strictly prohibited.

FIRST AID

Please be aware that a 24-hour first aid service is not available in the campsites.

Anyone requiring first aid must report to the Campsite Office, where the Campsite Duty Manager and Security Team have 24-hour contact with the Goodwood Control Room, who can administer first aid.

In an emergency, please call 999. The South East Coast Ambulance Service and Sussex Police have been briefed on the location of the campsites.

NOISE NUISANCE

The Members' Meeting event generates noise from its sporting and entertainment activities, but campers are not expected to endure noise deemed to be a nuisance between 10.30pm and 8.30am. Please be considerate to your neighbours. Persistent noise offenders will be removed from the campsites.

ORGANIC STATUS

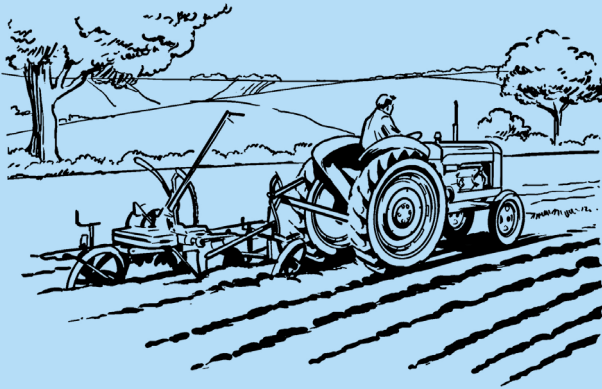
Goodwood Estate's Home Farm has been awarded full organic status by the Soil Association and DEFRA. In order to maintain this status we wish to keep our land free from man-made chemicals such as pesticides, insecticides and bleaches that pollute the ground and ultimately end up in the food chain. Please help us by not disposing of the following matter onto the ground: chemical waste from your onboard WC (please use the chemical waste disposal system adjacent to the shower and toilet blocks), domestic cleaning substances, boiling water and cigarette and cigar butts.

PETS

Only guide dogs are permitted on site at the Members' Meeting, including all camping and car parking areas.

RUBBISH

On arrival you will be issued with large bin liners for rubbish.



At the end of your stay, please place the bin liners and any waste in the skips adjacent to the shower and toilet blocks. Please leave your pitch in the state in which you found it.

Anyone choosing to ignore this condition will not be invited to camp at Goodwood in the future.
