<u>Darjeeling:</u> The finest Darjeeling from the foothills of the Himalayas with zesty bergamot citrus from sunny Southern Italy.

English Breakfast: Our signature blend is the ultimate British favourite. Three delicious teas: Assam, Ceylon, and a Lovely Rwandan blended to give a balanced, malty, zesty alliance.

Earl grey: A blend of powerful Assam and Rwandan with the more delicate Ceylon and Darjeeling to give the perfect strong tea base to compliment the zesty bergamot.

<u>Mint rubbed green:</u> Fresher and finer than any teabag mint you may have tasted as its brewed from whole peppermint leaves, giving a stronger and fresher flavour.

Rooibos: A nutrient rich blend of rooibos (Afrikaans for "red bush") and honey bush, two native South African shrubs. They grow only in the Cedarburg mountain region of South Africa.

Jasmine Pearl Green: The leaves of this beautiful green tea from Southern China are carefully hand rolled into a precious pearl then engulfed in fresh jasmine flowers. Leaving the tea to nestle amongst the flowers allows the natural floral scent to absorb into the tea, giving it a delicate, pure taste.

<u>Dragonwell:</u> Grown in the region of San Shai, in southern Taipei County, around 500m above sea level, Long Jing is hand-picked then pan fried, rolled and dried. The tea is not left to oxidise and hence has a natural smooth vegetal taste, and an aroma that is light with a hint of freshly cut grass.

About Goodwood House

The great Regency state apartments at Goodwood House were added to Brettingham's south wing from 1800 by the architect James Wyatt, together with the round towers. These wings and towers are in flint, an unusual material for a house of this size, which looks wonderful in the early morning or evening light, in the hoar frost or snow. The new large rooms were intended for entertaining and are used as such to this day. They house the earlier art collection, collected through the late 17th and 18th centuries, much of which had previously adorned Richmond House, the family's London home. This town house was destroyed by fire in 1791.

Goodwood House looks like three sides of an octagon, and it used to be thought that it was intended to build the complete figure, but this has never been proved. It is not known what the intentions were when this somewhat picturesque shape was devised, but the layout certainly works perfectly for a private family home combined with grand public apartments and far reaching views over the park.

The house has recently been refurbished by the Earl and Countess of March & Kinrara, giving it an up to date sense of the Regency, with strong colours and stylish drapes and fabrics.

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
